Welcome to the first newsletter of the year and a very special welcome back to all the children. We have had a lovely start to the year and I am really excited to be seeing you all and teaching the children again this year. English

English work will be linked to our class novels, Jungle Book and Favela Street Kid. We will also be exploring non-fictions texts linked to our Geography and Science topics. Children will also be developing knowledge and skills in grammar, spelling and punctuation (GPS), which will continue to be taught discretely each day. We are especially trying to focus on broadening the vocabulary of the children, and working hard to apply lots of the tricky curriculum vocabulary into our written work.



Spellings

We follow a spelling programme linked to the 'Spelling Shed'. Your child will be given new spellings to learn for a test at the end of each week. Your child will bring a copy of these spellings home in their spelling book and they are available for them to practise on the Spelling Shed. We will be developing the children's understanding and application of the words they bring home; please ensure that this is encouraged and discussed to further their 'home schooling' opportunities.



Maths

The children will work on activities to develop their mathematical knowledge and understanding in 5 key areas:

- Numbers and the Number System
- Calculations
- Reasoning
- Geometry

Religious Education

The topics for this term are:

- Domestic Church: Ourselves
- Baptism and Confirmation: Life Choices
- Other Religions: Judaism
- Advent/Christmas: Hope



Science

This term Year 5 will be studying topics on 'Earth, Sun and Moon' and 'Gravity, Resistance and Mechanical Forces'.



Foundation Curriculum

This term, Year 5 will learn all about Climate and Energy, in our Geography topics. They will also begin learning musicianship, listening and appraisal through their Ukulele sessions and further their knowledge of computer network and data handling in Computing.

Music

This year, the children will be learning to play the ukulele. Music lessons will take place next half term.

P.E.

P.E. will be on a **Friday** afternoon this year. Please ensure that children come to school wearing a full PE kit, including plain navy blue/black shorts or plain navy blue/black jogging bottoms and suitable footwear. Homework

Following feedback from parents, the school has decided to maintain its recent homework policy and asks for families to focus on spellings, times tables and reading rather than formalised written homework. Children who have been unable to complete their homework will be given the opportunity to complete it at a break time in school.

- ❖ **Spellings** will be set and tested on a <u>Tuesday</u> in line with the units from our The Spelling Shed scheme. There is also an app that can be downloaded to support this scheme. Children will take home spellings in their spelling book and will complete tests each week in the back of this book. It is essential these are with children in school each day.
- ❖ **Times tables** will be tested each week on a **Thursday** (tests will cover all times tables up to 12 x 12 and the related division facts).
- Reading books the children have been asked to read their reading books for just 10 minutes a night. They are encouraged to record this in their reading record and write comments about what they have read. Please listen to your child read and also complete the comment book weekly. It is important to your child's learning that they are heard reading by an adult every day for a few minutes. This does not always need to be your child's reading book personal books can be included too!
- Reading Plus Children complete Reading Plus in school for 3 30-minute sessions per week. There are 5 assignments to complete each week. It is vitally important that as well as the sessions in school, children complete all remaining Reading Plus assignments at home. This is monitored in school and any children who have been unable to do this at home will be given extra opportunities during break times at school.
