



Attainment in Swimming 2021-22

Updated July 2022

St Cuthbert's Catholic Primary School has worked tirelessly to ensure that the majority of pupils who leave Year 6 can swim at least 25m. To increase this percentage further, we have created additional opportunities for Years 4, 5 and 6 to achieve this target using the PE and Sport Premium Grant. We have set ourselves the aspirational target of 100% to achieve their 25 metres by the end of KS2 in line with current statutory expectations of the National Curriculum. **This has been adversely affected by the pandemic.**

We can report that:

Year 4 - We have 20 out of 30 confident swimmers in Year 6 - 67% and that is despite the global pandemic and interruption of our swim programme and lack of opportunities. 15 out of 30 have passed 25m or more - 50%. The remainder are currently still working towards the completion of 25m mark (1/7/22).

Year 5 - Year 5 provision will be increased from next academic year. This will target those children who have not achieved 25 m or above.

Year 6 - We have 24 out of 31 confident swimmers in Year 6 - 77% and that is despite the global pandemic and interruption of our swim programme. The remainder are currently still working towards the completion of 25m mark (1/7/22).

How many children can use a range of swimming strokes effectively?

In Year 6, 77% of children can use a range of strokes.

How many children can perform safe self-rescue in different water based situations?

Year 4 and 6 swimmers that have accessed lessons have completed water safety in June 2022.

New European Learn to Swim standards have been introduced and Swim England are working closely with our neighbouring countries on how these new standards can be introduced into schools and the curriculum. For more information, follow the link below.
